President's Message

Hi Everyone,

This past month was an eventful celestial calendar with an aurora borealis, comet, and meteor shower all visible in the CT night sky. For those who look beyond their busy lives, the world is filled with wonder if you just know enough to look up. Finding beauty is easy when you grow orchids, each month new wonders unfold, the swelling of a new eye on a rhizome, fresh green root tips emerging, buds breaking out of sheath, and the dazzling blooms with colors richer than any jewel. Now more than ever as the landscape sheds summers leafy tunic and the days grow darker in the northeast a bit of something green and growing brightens the day.

I hope everyone enjoyed last month's talk with Kim Fedderson, sadly I ended up missing the meeting, but looking forward to seeing everyone again this month and hearing about it. Our next meeting will be November 13th at the Cheshire Senior Center, with a talk by Dave Sorokowsky from Paph Paradise Orchids on Paphiopedilum culture titled, "Don't Fear the Slippers."

Daves Bio:

"After receiving his degree in biochemistry from the University of Toronto, Dave opted to step outside his chosen field and operated a tropical fish import business for eight years. Upon returning to school, Dave received a degree in enology and viticulture from Brock University in St. Catharine's, Ontario. While attending Brock, Dave began acquiring orchids one 2" pot at a time and before he graduated, Dave had over 100 orchids. Winemaking and a passion for orchids prompted Dave to seek a warmer climate in California about one year later. Dave has been growing paphiopedilums for about 20 years and seriously hybridizing for over 10 years. He is an accredited AOS judge, and his paphiopedilums have received over 100 awards to date from the AOS and CSA. Many of those awarded plants playing important roles in his breeding program. In 2018 Dave left winemaking in order to focus all of his time running Paph Paradise Orchids."

If you are a beginner or a seasoned grower, Dave is sure to have some useful advice for successfully growing and blooming slipper orchids. With a generally compact habit and lower light requirements than other orchids Paphs tend to be a good choice for the home windowsill grower or perhaps for a grow rack setup. In a greenhouse I tend to tuck them on the North shady side of benches behind and under other high light orchids where they grow luxuriously and flower constantly. When the greenhouse cat is doing his job and the mice aren't eating the flower buds, they are long lasting attractive flowers and there are generally slippers in bloom at all times of the year. Looking forward to seeing everyone at the monthly meeting this month!

October Meeting Minutes

COS met in Farmington on October 9th. Mary discussed the following prior to our guest speaker:

- 1. MOS (Massachusetts Orchid Society) is having their annual orchid show November 8-10 in Winchester MA https://www.massorchid.org/show. COS is participating and requests members provide blooming plants for display. Plants should be pre-registered with their names and categories and of course need to be bug free. Dave, Mary or Christian can help identify your orchid if you are in doubt. Plants need to get to either Dave Tognalli or Cheryl Mizak by November 6th. Set up for the MOS show will be November 7th between 10AM and 7PM. Christian will take down the COS display on Sunday November 10th.
- 2. At the October COS board meeting October 7th it was decided that the COS show will be held in October 2025. Dave will verify that the Bristol Senior Center has October 11-12 available.
- 3. COS wants to do a plant sale/ fundraiser May 10th in Southington similar to the one held in 2023. Mary will check to see if the Congregational Church is available.
- 4. COS is looking for someone to take Karen's role of hospitality/food coordinator since she is stepping down. It was suggested that perhaps we can get two people, one for our Cheshire meetings and one for Farmington meetings. The role includes purchasing coffee, water, snacks, cups, etc and setting up for the meetings and special events.
- COS is also in need of a Social Media Coordinator and Web Master for our site. This role can be combined or separate.

COS also needs a Show Committee Chair and Committee, an Advertising Lead for the 2025 show.

Elected Officers will remain the same for 2025.

- 5. The November meeting (Cheshire) will feature a discussion about slipper orchids
- 6. Our December meeting (Farmington) will be our annual Holiday Party

COS guest speaker, Kim Fedderson of Fair Orchids (www.fair_orchids.com) began his presentation discussing orchid virus'. He said that once a plant gets a virus it is almost impossible to bring it back. He does not recommend US tests for virus due to either false negative/false positive readings. Instead, he suggests using Agitest virus test kits. They have a shelf life of 18 months and do not require refrigeration. Bill Stender of Lehigh Valley offers them in bulk. Kim said virus can spread by using the same knife or scissor and reusing pots. He never reuses a plastic pot. He uses razor blades once and discards. When reusing clay pots, he soaks them in bleach prior to baking at 200 degrees for 4 hours. If you don't want to use your oven, a grill can be used instead. Kim showed photos of orchids with virus. Characteristics include streaking, splotches of color but he emphasized that seeing a streaky flower is not always an indication of virus.

Kim's presentation was about Cymbidiums. There are 61 varieties from Southeast Asia, India, Japan, New Guinea and Australia. He discussed growing conditions, classifications, flowers, hybrids, etc. He shared quite a bit of information with the group.




