Preparing for our show!

President's Message

Change is in the air as we head into the Fall Season. Almost overnight it feels like the sultry summer nights have given way to cooler and more comfortable temps. Nothing is constant except change, and in this lies opportunity for new experience and growth. Seasonality keeps things from growing stagnant and should prompt us to reassess how we are doing as growers. While some of our plants are adapted to specific growing conditions, it's often hard to replicate the conditions they need to thrive in our homes and grow areas. When something isn't thriving changing things up may help you discover the key to better cultural practices. Many of my plants are outside this time of year basking in better lighting and air circulation, soon it will be time for the migration back inside as night temps cool off. This always triggers a vigorous burst of new growth for me as the plants have been experiencing cooler and dryer conditions at the tail end of the summer outside and the move back into the humidity and warmth of the greenhouse triggers root growth. It's also a chance to re-organize and assess the collection. Right now is a good time of year for division and repotting while most plants are still in active growth.

As we come off the summer break from our regular meeting schedule we are jumping right back into the swing of things with our **September Show and Sale `Orchid Harvest'** at the Bristol Senior Center the weekend of **September 27th and 28th**. This is our biggest event of the year, and we hope that everyone will join in and volunteer to make this another successful show. Mary has put together a volunteer sign-up sheet outlining all the tasks and stations we will need to man over the weekend starting with setup on Friday the 26th. Please look over the sheet and see what areas still need volunteers. It's critical that we have enough volunteers to run the show throughout the weekend. We are asking if you have any time to volunteer from Friday to Sunday that everyone pitch in. **We can't make this happen without you!**

A huge part of our event will be the COS club display in the show area. We have the home field advantage and this is where we want to make our club shine by having the best display! Blooming plants and non-blooming filler plants are needed to create an outstanding display. If you have any blooming plants in your collection we need them to create the club display! Preregistration is required if you would like your plants judged, please see the website for plant registration information under the 2025 Show and Sale tab. More information will follow in reminder emails and we will go over how to register your plants at the September meeting. If you have any questions or need assistance, Dave Tognalli will be handling registration and will be able to answer any questions.

On **Thursday the 25**th, we will be able to get into the Senior Center at 4:30pm to begin dropping of supplies, infrastructure, plants onto the stage area of the cafeteria, we will be trying to get the bulk of our materials dropped off at this time.

On **Friday the 26**th, we will be able to start setup of the Show area in the cafeteria at 1:30pm and the Sales area in the gymnasium at 3pm. We will need as many sets up hands as possible at this time to get the floorplan setup and table covers on ahead of the arrival of our vendors and sister orchid societies. The club sales area setup, and the club plant display setup will be the two areas where we will need the most hands. Plants for the club display will need to be dropped off at this time for incorporation into the display.

On **Saturday the 27**th, the show will open at noon to the general public after the judging of the Show area is complete and will run until 5pm. At this time, we will need to man club stations and monitor the Sales and Show area.

On **Sunday the 28**th, the show will open at 10am and close at 4pm, breakdown of the Show and Sales area will begin once the doors close to the general public, and once again, we will need all hands on-deck to break down and cleanup, all the club supplies will need to be packed and returned to our storage area at Cheryl's.

At our regular monthly meeting on **September 10**th, we will be meeting at the Cheshire Senior Center to discussing volunteer roles and going over the plan for setup on Friday the 26th. If you are planning on volunteering at the Show and Sale, we strongly recommend that you attend the September meeting for discussion of roles and a briefing for what to expect. There will be a show table, so don't forget to bring along your blooming plants for the show table. It's always exciting to see what's coming into bloom, looking forward to an awesome show table!
